The General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) came into effect on 25th May 2018. It has brought higher standards of handling data and determines how people's personal data is processed and kept safe. GDPR is a piece of EU-wide legislation and schools have a legal duty to comply with the regulation. The GDPR is similar to the Data Protection Act (DPA) 1998 (which schools already comply with), but strengthens many of the DPA's principles.
