Writing

In English we will be reading *Traction Man Is Here* by Mini Grey. We will be using this story to help us design our own superhero character and write a comic strip adventure all about them. Our writing will focus on using different sentence types in-

cluding commands, statements, questions and exclamations. We will be doing lots of work to improve our spelling in our writing too!

We will be also focussing on reading comprehension and taking part in activities that develop our understanding of what we read.

National Curriculum Testing

During the month of May teachers will be administering the Key Stage One tests in Reading and Mathematics. Most pupils will be unaware they are taking the tests as teachers will incorporate them into everyday classroom practise. Teachers will use the outcomes and their knowledge of every child to help them reach an overall judgement of the standard each child has achieved by the end of year two.
