Reading

Phonics will continue on a daily basis this term as well as some small group phonics activities. Reading workshop will also continue every day. We will continue to focus on recognising the first 100 high frequency words and also to be able to apply our reading and phonics knowledge into our independent reading.



English

This half term we will be reading stories about Pirates, starting with the book 'The Night Pirates'. In the first couple of weeks we will be looking at story writing. Towards the end of this term, we will then move on to look at simple poetry and have a go at writing our own poem. We will continue learning how to construct simple sentences and practice incorporating the spelling rules we have learnt into our writing.

Mathematics

This half term we are continuing and extending our work on the following: reading, writing and ordering numbers 1 to 100, number bonds to 10 and 20, place value, addition and subtraction, introducing simple multiplication and division, looking at simple fractions, time, position and direction. We will continue exploring word problems and will be carrying out some investigations over the half term.

Registration Time

Children go to class at 8:55
