



English

We are working launching a new literacy curriculum this term. Our first text will be:



Maths



Curriculum



Reading

This half term, we are continuing with Destination Reader. Children will be reinforcing a range of core skills, including summarising, retrieval and clarifying vocabulary. A range of texts will be investigated, including poetry and stories from Brazil.

Writing

In Writing, children will be creating poetry inspired by our topic of Brazil. We will be using Myths and Legends from this country to base our poems on. Additionally, we will be consolidating all the Year 3 skills learned so far by writing a range of fiction and non fiction texts.

Mathematics

This half term in Maths, we will be focusing on a broad range of skills. These include reading analogue and digital clocks and converting time from 24 to 12 hour clocks. We will also be exploring shapes and their properties and identifying right angles and angles that are greater or less than a right angle. We will also be learning about different lines-vertical and horizontal lines.

Year Three Summer 2 2019

Science

This term our Science focus will be 'The rainforest as a habitat' which is linked to our topic. We will be learning about the different layers of the rainforest and creating our own multi-layered rainforest animal. We will also be holding a dedicated Science Week, when children will be inspired by a variety of investigations and experiments and looking at a scientist in depth.

Topic



Assessment

Assessment for Learning

- enables teachers to use information about students' knowledge, understanding and skills to inform their teaching
- teachers provide feedback to students about their learning and how to improve

Assessment as Learning

- involves students in the learning process where they monitor their own progress, ask questions and practise skills
- students use self-assessment and teacher feedback to reflect on their learning, consolidate their understanding and work towards learning goals

Assessment of Learning

 assists teachers to use evidence of student learning to assess student achievement against learning goals and standards

Registration Time

Children go to class at 8:55

They begin their learning as soon as they enter the classroom. This learning addresses core skills and embeds their understanding of areas such as grammar and maths.

It's important that pupils do not miss these sessions, so getting to school on time is key to their learning.
