On Thursday, Years 3 & 4 were treated to a special Black History Month assembly featuring Jali Bakary Konte, a singer and musician, originally from Gambia in West Africa.

Jali has been playing the Kora, a 21-stringed instrument that is native to Gambia, since the age of seven! It was a great way to learn about Gambian culture and music, as well as a chance to reflect on the contribution and influence African music has had on the world.





The children asked a lot of questions. Jali taught us a bit about how he plays the Kora, as well as encouraged the children to sing a call-and-response melody. Everyone got involved and some of us danced along!

Flu Vaccinations

FLU VACCINATION NASAL SPRAY TUESDAY 5th NOVEMBER 2019

All children in primary school will be offered flu vaccination through a nasal spray. Your child will be offered a flu vaccine that is given as a simple spray up the nose. It is painless, very quick, and serious side effects are uncommon. This vaccination programme is designed to protect your child against flu.


