Science

Our topic this term will be Rocks and Soils. The children will have practical opportunities to handle a range of rocks and practically investigate their permeability. The children will also investigate how different rocks are formed.

Topic

In their topic lessons, children will be studying History and Geography this half term. In History our focus will be on The Roman Empire and it's impact on Britain. In Geography we will explore climate zones, volcanoes and earthquakes which ties into our text 'Escape from Pompeii.
