This half term, we are continuing with Destination Reader. Children will be reinforcing a range of core skills, including summarising, retrieval and clarifying vocabulary. Our key focus for this will be the Anglo-Saxon story *Beowulf*.

Writing

Mathematics

We will also be focusing on area and getting to grips with fractions.
