










	<p><b>English</b></p> <p>Learning linked to theme of 'Transition Week'</p>
<p><b>LITTLE MOMENTS BIG MEMORIES</b></p>	<p><b>Memories of Year 1</b></p> <p>If you cast your mind back to the time we spent together as a class, what are the memories that make you smile? They could be topic or subject based like when the moon disappeared, or maybe some of the funny things we did in phonics and class discussions. Maybe you have memories of things you did with friends or times you laughed with your teacher. Make a list of all your favourite memories from Year 1.</p> <p><b>CHALLENGE YOURSELF:</b> Draw your favourite memory from Year 1.</p>
	<p><b>Proudest moments</b></p> <p>Even though we missed part of our year together, you have all achieved so much and should be very proud of yourselves. Make a list of times where you glowed with pride during your time in Year 1...it could be related to a performance you did, a moment when you realised you could do something you thought was too tricky or even when you'd done something that made someone else feel happy, helped or comforted.</p> <p><b>CHALLENGE YOURSELF:</b> Tell a friend or family member about your proudest moment from Year 1 and find out about something they have done in their life that they are proud of.</p>
	<p><b>Questions, questions...</b></p> <p>You are all going to have a great time in Year 2 and you're very much up to the challenge, but what questions do you have about moving that little way along the corridor to Year 2? Jot down any questions you have about coming back to school in September. Remember to use a question mark at the end of each question.</p> <p><b>CHALLENGE YOURSELF:</b> Can you include questions that start with each of these question words: Who, What, When, Where, Why, How...sdf?</p>
	<p><b>Words of wisdom</b></p> <p>Do you remember this time last year, when you were in Reception and just about to start Year 1? Were you happy and excited or a little bit nervous? Now that you are experts at Year 1, what advice would you give to the reception children who will be wondering and maybe even worrying about their new year group?</p> <p><b>CHALLENGE YOURSELF:</b> Can you start some of your nuggets of wisdom with the words 'always', 'sometimes' and 'never'?</p>
	<p><b>Tell your Year 2 teacher...all about you!</b></p> <p>Your Year 2 teacher would love to get a head start on getting to know you so why not write them a letter telling them about yourself? You could tell them about your household, your pets, your hobbies, your favourite games, subjects, activities and book characters, or maybe even your favourite places.</p> <p><b>CHALLENGE YOURSELF:</b> Can you make your teacher laugh by finishing your letter with a funny story about something funny that happened when you were with your family?</p>
