









Resource Base Home Learning: Autumn 1

This half term, our topic will be 'Looking after Ourselves and Each Other'. We will be focusing our learning around our core text, 'Here we are' by Oliver Jeffers.

We would like you to **complete at least two of the items listed in column 1** and then to choose some, or all, of the tasks in column 2. All written tasks can be completed in your home learning book, and pictures of practical tasks can be posted on our class blog.

<p>Write a biography about the author and illustrator Oliver Jeffers.</p> <p>Who was he and what is his background? How does he see the world? Why did he choose to write books? What other interesting projects has he made? Make sure that your writing is factual and include images.</p> 	<p>Can you create a model of a planet?</p> <p>Have a go at creating your own planet! What colour would it be? What would it be called? Use any recyclable materials you have available at home. Include a short description of your planet and what living things you can find there.</p> 
<p>Write a persuasive letter to the headteacher.</p> <p>How could we sustain the positive changes to our environment that occurred during lockdown? What suggestions can you offer to make our school more environmentally friendly? You might consider how much paper and electricity are used. Could we also add more green spaces to the school? Remember to be persuasive! The best letters will be sent to Manda</p>  	<p>Can you make a skeleton?</p> <p>In science this half term, we will be learning about looking after ourselves and others, with a particular focus on changes and growing. Create a timeline included the stages of your growth so far. Include photos and labels. Can you add a short description of the changes you experienced at each stage? E.g. I grew my first tooth...</p> 
<p>Write a poem!</p> <p>Write a poem describing our world Earth. Choose between a free verse poem, or a rhyming poem. You can make your poetry interesting by using powerful adjectives.</p>  	<p>What positive dreams do you have about the world?</p> <p>What do you hope our world will look like in the future? How would you like people to treat our planet and why? Discuss the importance of taking care of the planet and why this is important for your future. Design a drawing or painting of the earth, and your dreams surrounding the planet.</p>
