ADJECTIVES



Adjectives are words that describe nouns.

Introduction to 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears:'

What do you already know about the character Goldilocks? Did she think about how the bears may feel when she went into the Bears house?

Look back at your word bank from Monday and have a think about why you decided to choose each adjective to describe Goldilocks. Remember – a statement is *giving* information and a question is *asking* for information.

Create your own 'WANTED' poster for Goldilocks who hasn't returned back to her home! Use the bank of adjectives you've created to describe Goldilocks.

Challenge: Use a range of statements and questions in your poster.



When you see the digraph 'ay', it usually makes the same sound as digraph 'ai'.



Go to www.phonicsplay.co.uk and play a game of Dragon's Den > phase 5 > 'ie'. Make a list of all the real and alien words. Choose at least three of the real 'ie' words and write sentences for them.



Let's remind ourselves about the 'ea' digraph:

When you see the digraph 'ea', it usually makes the same sound as digraph 'ai' or the phoneme 'e'.

Go to www.phonicsplay.co.uk and play a game of Dragon's Den > phase 5 > 'ea'. Make a list of all the real and alien words. Choose at least three of the real 'ea' words and write sentences for them.
