Black History Celebration Events

We have had a fantastic week of activities and events to celebrate Black History Month. Children really enjoyed finding out about key historical figures and have produced some wonderful learning as a result. Please see below for a taster of some of the activities and events we were able to enjoy.

Early Years Foundation Stage



The children in Nursery and Reception read the story 'Coming to England' by Floella Benjamin. They learnt about Floella's childhood journey from Trinidad and Tobago to England, her adventures on the 15-day boat journey and her first impressions of the United Kingdom. The children made masks. head dresses and



shakers and celebrated the end of the week with a Trinidadian Carnival.



Year 1

Children in year 1 explored the book **'The Proudest Blue'** written by the pioneering Olympic athlete Ibtihaj Muhammad. They also expored Tingatinga art and created their own creative works in the style of the Tanzanian artist Edward Said Tingatinga.



Year 2



The Year 2 children were lucky enough to have a virtual reading and question

session with Genicha West, an ex pupil who is now a published author. *My Friend Nabila* is a powerful story about friendship which explores the issue of racism and racist bullying within a school context. The session gave children the opportunity to reflect on and explore ways in which we can stand together to challenge racism and racist behaviours.



Year 3



Year 3 loved exploring the artistic works of Chris Ofili, British artist and Turner Prize Winner. They used his work as inspiration for their own creations based on their favourite singers and musicians.

They were also inspired by the work of the British space scientist Maggie Aderin-Pocock MBE, has passion for science and how it helped her to overcome her dyslexia.



Year 4



The children in year 4 explored the life and work of Olive Morris. They had a virtual workshop with the actress and singer Lorna Gayle who helped them to explore the concept of activism and standing up for your beliefs.

This afternoon, I enjoyed the workshop with Lorna Gayle. I liked it because she told us how Olive Morris' life was and the amazing changes that she made during her lifetime. She also called us activists. I thought she was really nice. She was an artist, singer and an actress. Lorna was very inspiring.

They used the book *Hidden Figures* to support their research and created their own newspaper articles to celebrate the incredible achievements of these women.

Y6 were very excited to have a virtual meeting with the actress and star of Tina Turner the Musical, Aisha Jawando.

Resource Base

In the green pathway, the children learnt about Martin Luther King. They watched a video of his famous 'I have a dream' speech and children children to write their own speeches and art work inspired by famous black icons from the worlds of sports and politics.

researched interesting facts about their significant figures. They created art decorations using their hands to represent diversity and equality.

Dance

Children in Key Stage Two worked with Deme to produce their own creative responses to the choreographic work of Ashley Banjo and his piece representing the Black Lives Matter movement. They also learned about pioneers in the dance world, viewing works by Alvin Ailet and Ballet Black and the opening set from Glastonbury performed by Stormzy.

Despite the fact they have only been learning for a few weeks, the children in year 5 have done a fantastic job learning the musical accompaniment on the steel pans.
