A member of the team will have been in touch with you if your child is invited to attend these sessions.

We are currently developing a MS Teams handbook and some instructional videos to help you with accessing videos, uploading assignments and attending virtual meetings. I am hoping we will be able to share these with you early next week. In the meantime, please get in touch if you are having any difficulty accessing the learning and we will do our best to help. 
Kobi's Art Competition

Free School Meal Vouchers













I am sure you will have heard about some of the discussion in the media this week about providing food for children during this period of National Lockdown. This week, Chartwells have provided food hampers for families who requested them.

Following much debate and thanks largely to the work of campaigners such as Marcus Rashford, the Government have agreed to issue vouchers to families eligible for benefits related Free School Meals. We will be accessing vouchers via the Government Edenred portal which will allow you to select from a range of supermarkets, including; Morrisons, Asda, Tesco, Sainsburys, Iceland, Aldi and Tesco.

We want to be able to provide every child with equal access to remote learning and will therefore be setting up a funding page for those of you who may wish to make a donation towards the purchase of additional laptops for those in most need.

Message from the Director for Children and Young People

Across the country and particularly in London and the South East, Coronavirus continues to spread rapidly and Lewisham's infection rate is at its highest ever level. Our schools are working hard to deliver teaching and learning both to pupils at home and those attending on site and to keep children and adults who are on site as safe as possible.

Keeping the number of people in schools as low as possible

We need to ensure that the number of children in schools is kept as low as possible, whilst making sure that children who need to be in school can be.

The government says that this is not because schools have become less safe for children and young people. Having fewer people in schools is about reducing the overall number of contacts everyone has in the community, which is important to help reduce the pressure on the NHS.

During this lockdown, children should stay at home where possible.

We recognise the challenges everyone is facing at the moment, particularly families with children and young people.
