to <u>music@torridonprimary.lewisham.sch.uk</u> or hand it into the office before Monday May 17th so that we can plan for this provision to start from next half term.





Governors are not responsible for the day-to-day management of the school; but they do have an important role within the school.

The Governing Board should reflect the school community and we currently feel that this is not the case at Torridon. In light of this, all applications are welcome but we would particularly welcome applications from parents and carers from Black, Asian or Minority Ethnic backgrounds. If you are an HR expert so much the better but what is *most* important is a keen interest in taking our school forward. Governors do not need any formal qualifications but must be aged 18 years and have a child at Torridon.

You **don't** need to be an expert, training is available and your fellow governors are also a good source of information. THEY will also look forward to learning about YOUR experience and perspective as a parent/carer.


What is the time commitment?

Governors currently meet as a full Governing Body 4 times each year, with additional regular committee meetings and/or working party meetings throughout each term. Papers for each meeting are circulated 7 days ahead. They will usually take a couple of hours to read through and think about the questions you will want to ask.

We also ask each Governor to be a Link Governor taking a special interest in a particular area of the life of the school. This could be something you know about already or an area where you would like to develop your knowledge through training. Each Link Governor will liaise with the school to work out the best way for them to monitor their area. Most times this will involve visiting during the school day but the last year has shown that there are some things which can be done over Zoom. After the visit Governors write up a short Note of Visit so that their findings can be shared with other Governors.
