Message from the Governing Board

Dear Parents and Carers

What a year, and **what** an end to the year. But we have all got there! And we are all hopeful that the situation will have improved when we return in September.

This time last year the Governing Board told you that we wanted to find more opportunities to get to hear your views and listen to the things about school life which are important to you. We didn't have many opportunities to do that, but we have been busy working with our dedicated school leaders to support them through this strange year.

As a Governing Board we are immensely proud of and grateful for the amazing work that Manda, Claire, Richard, Kate and Lena have done to steer the school through such a challenging period. All the staff at Torridon have been tireless in their efforts to deliver the very best for children and the wider school community. As a governing board we consider ourselves privileged to work with such committed and imaginative professionals.

The Governing Board is grateful too for all that YOU have done this year. There have now been four terms where the pandemic has disrupted the normal day to day schooling we so often take for granted. There have been huge challenges, including multiple lockdowns, and the need to shift to online learning for children when year group bubbles have burst. You have worked with the school to make online learning happen and to let us know when you have needed equipment or for your children to be on site.

This has emphasised that we all have a shared priority – your children.

Keeping the school running smoothly and developing a strong online learning offer are only part of what has been going on this academic year. The Governing Board has also been working to ensure that the vision for the school is delivered - that all our children are able to achieve their best.

The Governing Board runs three different committees: (1) Teaching and Learning; (2) Children, Families and Community; and (3) Resources. Across these committees we have heard about a range of activities through the academic year:

In Teaching and Learning committee:

- Governors have heard about the exciting new whole school curriculum. Staff from both Key Stages have played a part in its development. The curriculum weaves in 'golden threads' so that children can make the link between different subjects.
- Governors have established a new "data group" working with senior leaders to embed consistent monitoring of pupil progress and attainment.
- Governors have been keen to ensure that children's wellbeing is the schools' top priority, and we have been
 pleased to see that the school has run daily personal, health and social education to support children in
 understanding and dealing with the impact of the pandemic.

In Children, Families and Community committee:

- Governors are delighted that the support for our local community, (organised through the school but made possible by **you**) has been recognised by the local authority
- Governors have been concerned to hear that even very young children are seeing things on social media that, really, they should not see. We would like to work with parents and carers so that young people can benefit from social media and not be harmed by it.
- We want the Governing Board to mirror our community. We are setting up a Parents & Carers Forum where
 Parent & Carer Champions can work with governors to discuss key issues affecting the school. If you would

Through the Resources committee:

- Governors have supported the transition to home schooling during lockdowns, including overhauling old IT systems, buying new laptops for pupils and staff, and working to ensure all families can get access to the lessons that staff have prepared
- We have reviewed the school's programme to refresh classrooms and improve the school site so that over the next year, and as restrictions lift, we can make our facilities available to the community to rent
- We have also done important work establishing a budget strategy to support the delivery of high quality education for our children

All governors are very aware of the impact of the loss of at least 60 days schooling since the pandemic began. We recognise it is vital that we take time to understand the different experience of each individual child and that we support the school in planning how best to tackle this challenge. This is something that each of our committees will scrutinise in the next school year.

Thank **you** for all **your** support for the school across the past year. It has been a challenging time for all of us, and we can but hope there are brighter and "normal" days ahead for the coming year.

We hope that (after a well-deserved rest over the summer) we come back in September with a clear focus on how to help children catch up on the learning and out of hours activities they have missed due to the pandemic.

We send best wishes to the staff who are moving on from Torridon. We are sure that their time here will have left them with some great memories. A particular mention goes to Dot Hallam, who must have educated around 750 children during her career at Torridon. Her legacy is the love of science and gardening – our green future will be safe in the hands of her pupils. We look forward to welcoming new team members in September.

A final word of thanks to the Friends of Torridon. They have done a brilliant job fundraising and, as a result, next week will see the start of the installation of exciting new playground equipment. The current committee are taking a break and we look forward to working with their successors.
