Jas studied at Berklee College of Music where she began to explore the common grounds between Jazz and Afrobeat. She has worked with many other leading Jazz lights including Alfa Mist, Nubya Garcia and Jorja Smith. She also played alongside Lenny Kravitz in the music video for his song Low!

Jas will be leading this half term project on the music of the greatest female jazz musicians. The course is open to all young musicians aged 11-18. It will be a chance to explore the world of jazz, experiment with improvisation, and experience playing live jazz with other young musicians.

- You should be able to play an instrument (your instrument could be voice, percussion or any instrument not usually thought of as jazz) and we welcome all levels of experience.
- · You should be interested in playing as part of a group, but you do not need to have any prior ensemble experience.
