
This week we have been learning about Chinese New Year. We found out that it was the year of the Tiger. Year 6 have made Chinese New Year posters to celebrate.





### Year 5 Chocolate Investigation

In Year 5, children were provided with a challenge that offered the opportunity to demonstrate and develop their understanding of fractions as well as use mathematical vocabulary. They had to imagine (if necessary!) that everyone enjoys chocolate and wants to have as much as possible.



Table 1 has one block of chocolate on it, table 2 has two blocks of chocolate on it and, guess what, table 3 has three blocks of chocolate on it. Children approached the tables one by one and ask themselves: *"If the chocolate on the table I sit at is to be shared out equally when I sit down, which would be the best table to sit at?"*
