



## Reception Home Learning: Summer 1

This half term, our topic will be 'Down at the Bottom of the Garden'. We will be focusing our learning around the core texts, 'Jack and the Beanstalk' and 'First Day at Bug School.'

We would like you to **complete at least two of the items listed in column 1** and then to choose some, or all, of the tasks in column 2. All designing and written tasks can be completed in the children's home learning book.

<p><b>Bug Hunt</b></p> <p>Go on a bug hunt around your garden (if you have one) or in the park or wherever you would like. How many different bugs can you find? Write a list of all you've found, you could even draw a picture as well!</p> 	<p><b>Grow Your Own Beanstalk!</b></p> <p>Can you grow your own bean? (Or plant, cress etc) What does it need to grow? How does it change each week? You could keep a diary to show this.</p> 
<p><b>Butterfly Doubling</b></p> <p>Draw the outline of a butterfly (a grown up can help you) and choose a number 1-5. Paint that number of spots on one wing and fold over to discover the double!</p> 	<p><b>Bring a Bug to Life</b></p> <p>Have a go at making your very own bug. You can choose how to make this; maybe you'd like to paint it, create a collage or even some sort of model. We can't wait see you bugs.</p> 
<p><b>Mini-beast Fact File</b></p> <p>Choose your favourite mini-beast and create your very own fact file with all the information you can find out. Maybe there's a really interesting fact you could share with your family and friends.</p> 	<p><b>Feed the Birds</b></p> <p>Can you make a bird feeder? Thread some cheerios onto a pipe cleaner (or some string) and tie it to a tree for the birds <b>OR</b> spread a peanut butter on a cardboard shape. Dip the peanut butter shape into some bird seed and hang up.</p>
