We would like you to **complete at least two of the items listed in column 1** and then to choose some, or all, of the tasks in column 2. All written tasks can be submitted on Microsoft Teams, and practical tasks can be brought into school.

<p><b>Mythical Creatures</b></p> <p>Roman Gods come with imaginative, incredible myths. Famous ones include creatures such as the Centaur, Cyclops, Medusa, Minotaur, Phoenix and Cerberus. Create your own mythical creature.</p> 	<p><b>Shield and Sword</b></p> <p>Gladiators needed shields to protect themselves from their opponent and they were often brightly decorated. Create your own Roman shield.</p> 
<p><b>A feast fit for an Emperor</b></p> <p>Roman elites and emperors loved indulging themselves and having great big feasts. Create a menu for your desired feast as Emperor of your Roman Empire.</p> 	<p><b>Marvellous Mosaics</b></p> <p>Ancient Romans had a range of different art styles. One way they showed their creativity was through Mosaic – combining small colourful squares in patterns to create one larger image. Have a go at making a Roman Mosaic piece.</p> 
<p><b>Pass!</b></p> <p>In an open space, see how far you can accurately pass to your partner. How many different ways can you use your body and the ball to pass?</p>	<p><b>Human metal detector</b></p> <p>Investigate magnetic objects in your home by attaching a magnet to your hand and becoming the human detector. See what objects you feel your hand and magnet becoming attracted to.</p>
