# But life does not stand still and there is a further opportunity to nominate a parent governor. Would YOU like to be part of the team delivering Torridon's vision and value?

"The school has a compelling vision for an inclusive, high-quality education for all which enables our children to achieve and thrive regardless of background. Our Core Values underpin all policies and practice. To this end, leaders at all levels ambitiously and purposefully work to achieve short- and long-term goals".

Manda and her team have daily front-line responsibility for this. The governing board is a group of community representatives who work with Manda to keep the Vision and Values fresh and relevant, to hold school leaders to account for the educational performance of the organisation and its pupils, and the performance management of staff and to ensure that all resources are being used effectively The Governing Board is a diverse group of people - although the men are seriously outnumbered! There are 4 parent governors (including this vacancy) so you will not be alone. As a parent governor you will bring a parent's perspective to the discussion as well as your own personal skills and insights. It's a fine line to tread, but you're not there to speak on behalf of parents. The Governing Board needs your perspective to help the board make good decisions and maintain a link between governors are also a good source of information. THEY will also look forward to learning about YOUR experience and perspective as a parent/carer.

#### What is the time commitment?

Governors currently meet as a full Governing Body 4 times each year, with additional regular committee meetings and/or Working Party meetings throughout each term. Papers for each meeting are circulated 7 days ahead. They will usually take a couple of hours to read through and think about the questions you will want to ask.

We also ask each governor to be a link governor taking a special interest in a particular area linked to the School Improvement Plan or another identified priority. Each link governor will liaise with the school to work out the best way for them to monitor their area. Most times this will involve visiting during the school day but the last year has shown that there are some things which can be done over MS Teams. After the visit governors write up a short Note of Visit so that their findings can be shared with other Governors.

#### Extra polio vaccine dose for children in Lewisham



There are signs the virus may be spreading in London and the number of children vaccinated in London is lower than it should be. Boosting immunity in children should help protect them and reduce the risk of the virus continuing to spread in Lewisham and beyond.

If your child is eligible for an extra dose, the NHS will contact you to ask you to book an appointment for the vaccine.

# R/FUNNY

Reddit describes itself as a social news website where users connect and share stories, opinions and support; debate issues; ask questions; and chat to people with similar interests. Discussion topics are organised into communities (known as subreddits) that are created, run and populated by users, who remain anonymous throughout. Free speech is encouraged, and users – or 'redditors' – can vote posts 'up' or 'down' so they get more (or less) attention. Reddit is free to join, although signing up to Reddit Premium unlocks an advert-free version of the platform.

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If a person says something critical or offensive to your child on Reddit, it's natural that they'll want to respond. Explain to them, however, that is exact the reaction that trolls look for. Don't give them the satisfaction: instead, report the comment to Reddit Support for investigation. Blocking a user stops them from messaging or following your child on the platform.
