







## Year 2 Home Learning: Autumn 1 2022

This half term, our topic will be 'Dungeons and Dragons'. We shall be focusing our learning around our core texts, 'Tell Me a Dragon' by Jackie Morris and 'The Dragon Machine' by Helan Ward'. We would like you to **complete at least two of the items listed in column 1** and then to choose **some, or all, of the tasks in column 2**. All written tasks can be submitted on Microsoft Teams, and practical tasks can be brought into school.

<p><b>Design and describe a dragon</b></p> <p>Design your own dragon, and tell us all about it! Does your dragon breathe out fire hotter than lava? Try your best to add lots of description by using adjectives and similes in your writing. 😊</p> 	<p><b>Make a castle</b></p> <p>Use recycled materials to junk model a castle.</p> 
<p><b>Make a model dragon</b></p> <p>Can you make a model of a dragon using things that are ready to go into the recycling bin?</p> 	<p><b>Healthy lifestyles</b></p> <p>Draw and label a balanced plate of food. You could even try making it and taking a picture with an adult!</p> 
<p><b>Seasonal change</b></p> <p>There are four different seasons throughout the year. What are they called, and what months of the year are they in? Have a go at making a poster all about the four seasons. You could even write about which season is your favourite and why...</p> 	<p><b>What time is it?</b></p> <p>Have a go at making your own clock to tell and show the time. Remember that the long hand is the minute hand, and the short hand is the hour hand. Can you tell the time at o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to?</p>
