### Term Time Holidays



- Taking children on holiday or out of school during term time is against the law.
- The school is not allowed to authorise absence during term time, unless there are exceptional reasons (this does NOT include sickness of a family member).
- Taking unauthorised holidays could result in a penalty notice from the Local Authority.



It is extremely important that children attend school every day to enable them to make progress and achieve. Just one day's absence can mean that children find it difficult to keep up with their learning for the rest of the week, or longer.

Our attendance target is **97%** and we work extremely hard to ensure that we meet that target. We work closely with families where children are persistently absent to try and support them to improve their child's attendance. The Local Authority Attendance Officer visits the school regularly to monitor attendance and punctuality.

#### Persistent Absencer

If a child is attending for less than 90% of the time, this is classed as persistent absence. This means that a child is missing, on average, almost one day a week of his/her education. This will have a significant impact on his/her ability to achieve and often leads to anxiety about catching up.

### Punctuality

The school gates open at 8.45am and close at 8.55am. All children should be in their classroom ready to start the day at 9.00am.

Any child arriving after 9.05am will be recorded as late.

Being ill may prevent your child from going to school, but if he/she
can get out of bed and play, or watch television, he/she should be at
school!

### Reporting Absence

If your child is absent from school ,you need to let us know. You can I do this by:

Ringing or emailing the school office.

• Reporting your child's absence in person at the school office.

If absences are prolonged and without medical authorisation, parents or carers may face court proceedings.

## I Medical Appointments

We request that all medical appointments are made outside of school hours. If you have to take your child to an appointment, this needs to authorised by the Headteacher. You will need provide evidence of the appointment (booking letter etc).

# Is it really serious if your child is not in school?

Yes! Look at this example: James has 90% attendance. Sounds good doesn't it? But is it? 90% attendance/= ½ day missed every week % attendance/= 4 whole weeks of lessons missed every year. That's ?

90% attendance = 4 whole weeks of lessons missed every year. That's 100 hours of learning!
