If you were going on a seaside adventure, what would you pack in your suitcase and why? Draw and label what you would take with you, and tell us why you have chosen those items. Don't forget to use finger spaces, capital letters and full stops in your writing.



Diorama dreams...

Create a 3D model of an underwater world.

Dioramas are a great way to create wonderful settings, so get creative! Why not make some finger puppets too, and use them to create your own 'under the sea' story?



Reusable shopping bags:

Can you make a tally chart?

Make a tally chart, and ask the people you know whether they recycle or not. You may want to add more categories by including if they recyle paper, plastic or food etc.



Design your own reusable shopping bag to encourage people not to waste plastic bags. Which material would you use for your

What would be most suitable: metal, glass, wood, plastic, foil?

Why? Does it need to be waterproof or not?

Research an endangered sea creature.

Have a go at writing a fact file about your chosen endangered sea creature. Why are they endangered? Is it due to being hunted, or is their habitat being polluted?



Design a poster...

Have a go at drawing or creating an underwater scene. You could even try to make it 3D and include some pop-up or 'lift-flap' facts to encourage people to save our oceans and recycle.
