Christmas Assemblies





Come out of Hiding



Group A Strep in Children and Young People



What to look out for over the holiday

You may have seen news reports about Group A Strep infections in children and young people. These infections such as Strep Throat and Scarlet Fever are usually mild, with symptoms such as sore throat, mild fever and minor skin infections, and are treated with antibiotics.

However in rare cases they can be more serious. Signs of a more serious Group A Strep infection mean that you should get an urgent GP appointment or help from NHS 111 – these include high fever, severe muscle ache, localised muscle pain and unexplained diarrhoea or vomiting.

If your child is having difficulty breathing, their skin, tongue or lips are turning blue, or if they will not wake up or stay awake you should call 999 or go to A and E.

If you are receiving certain benefits, you may qualify to get a payment when the average temperature in your area gets to zero degrees or lower for seven consecutive days. You'll get £25 for each day of very cold weather.

Grants from energy suppliers

Some energy suppliers are offering grants to their customers to help them pay off their bills. Contact your supplier if you are struggling to pay – they may be able to help.


