The aim of Autism Acceptance Week is to help more people understand what autism is, as well as the ways it can affect life for autistic people. At Torridon we celebrate inclusion and diversity and our focus this week has been celebrating autism and the theme of colour. The children have been learning about how children with autism experience the world and the challenges they can face. We also have been looking at the theme of kindness and understanding towards other children and how the children can support their classmates and friends who have autism.

The whole school have been doing activities to promote their understanding of autism and celebrate the wonderful mix of diverse children we have at the school.

We held special assemblies to learn a little more about how we can help our autistic friends in class and on the playground.

Callie-Rose (Year 4) chose to carry her learning on at home and created this wonderful speech:

Autism Week

If you have autism it doesn't matter, that means you are special and unique. The loud noises may be too much for you but everybody is different. Touches can be too much and that doesn't make a difference because nobody is the same and they will never be the same.

Example:

If you're wearing a jumper and it starts to get really itchy on your skin, you just have to take it off.

Everyone comes in different colours, shapes and sizes so if you have autism you have a special feature as everybody has different special features.

You need to be brave, things may be hard but staying calm will help. Try your best, even if it's hard to do.


Keep going on no matter what and do what makes you happy. Nobody deserves to be sad.














It was wonderful to see all of your creations displayed this week.

1. The Creative Corner


An Outside Space and innovative curriculum to promote teaching and showcasing of the creative and performing arts in a bespoke outdoor setting - The Creative CORNER


