
NEU Strike Action Thursday 27th April

Year 1 Topic Launch





PE was a drill session, with marching and lots of exercises, while maths was repeating and copying the two times table. After a while, the children decided that they no longer wanted to be at Victorian school so they learnt about the jobs that Victorian children had to do and wrote to apply for jobs as chimney sweeps, maids or in workhouses. The children also learnt a verse of the nation anthem and stood up to sing it to a picture of Queen Victoria, before learning and performing a wonderful paired dance.
