Green Pathway this week have made fantastic space rockets, they have also been working hard to write their own instructions so that everyone can join in with the fun!








Year 1 – Environmental Posters











Year 2 – Report Writing

Year 4 - Diary Writing





Matthew Henson's Story told by Year 4.

We have been so impressed by their ambitious vocabulary choices, improved handwriting and eagerness to try out the new sentence structures that they have heard in their reading lessons.





