
fundraising for Friends of Torridon PTA towards the Outdoor Learning Space. Your items will be delivered to school and handed to your child to bring home in 2 weeks.

Reception Phonics and Early Reading Workshop

Thank you to all that were able to come to the phonics and early reading workshop, I hope it was helpful. If you were unable to attend, please find the PowerPoint uploaded on Teams. The children in reception have engaged so well with their phonics learning and we are really impressed with their progress.

Once children in reception are secure in blending, they will read a book at their instructional level in a small group three times a week. The book that your child has read during the week will then be set as home learning on our e-reader. To access the book, you will need to use the following website and information:

*Please note that special characters such as apostrophes or hyphens are not included in usernames. If your child's name contains these characters, you will not need to enter them.

Once you have logged in, you will be able to view all reading books which have been set for your child: see right. Please listen to your child practise reading this book and ask them questions to check their understanding. This is an essential part of children's home learning in reception.

Year 1 – Computing



In computing this week, Year 1 have been developing their mouse skills. We carefully drew self-portraits on Paint. Have a look!



Year 2 - Maths



This week in Year 2, we have had lots of fun learning how to read and show the time on an analogue clock. We made different times on a clock to see how accurately we could show the time. We worked carefully to make sure that the minute hand and the hour hand were in the right position on the clocks. After that, we practiced using time vocabulary that we learned in our maths sessions to show o'clock, half past, quarter past and quarter to. Some of us even began to explore five minute intervals.








Year 3 – PSHE

In PSHE this half term we are going to be celebrating differences. We have been thinking about people who are special to us and how our families are all different.



Year 4 – Geography

In year 4, we started our 'Discovering the Ice Caps' theme by using our geographical skills to learn about lines of latitude. To do this, we looked at globes and gathered knowledge from different sources to prove whether a set of statements about lines of latitude were true or false. We also, furthered our learning about the North and South Poles and the similarities and differences between them. We will use this information to improve our writing this term, which is inspired by Race to the Frozen North, which is a remarkable true story about Matthew Henson's expedition to the North Pole.



Year 5 Learning

Year 5 had fun starting a new maths topic of 'fractions' this week. They have already looked at parts and wholes as well as exploring equivalent fractions!





In Geography, children compared lines of longitude and latitude. Additionally, they used atlases to locate countries and explained how their proximity to the equator might affect their climate.

What we offer:

- 1-hour clinic appointment with experienced Family Support Coordinators who provide support for parents/carers in:
 - Understanding more about autism.
 - Information about accessing local services and benefits.
- For families resident in Lewisham, access to ongoing support (Comeback Service).
- A drop-in service at Kaleidoscope on the first Monday of each month (term-time only) 10.00 – 12.00.

How to access our service:

- Paediatricians and other Kaleidoscope diagnosing teams can automatically refer families after diagnosis. This includes families diagnosed at Kaleidoscope but living in other boroughs. These families will receive an initial 1-hour clinic only.
- We accept referrals from other professionals working with diagnosed children living in the borough.
- · Families of diagnosed children can also self-refer.

TALKING TEENS 🖚



Family Thrive Early Help Co-ordinators are running a free course for parents or carers of teenagers and pre-teens who are looking to better understand and communicate with them – It offers an opportunity to understand what's going on in the adolescent brain and how to understand their feelings and behaviours using an authoritative parenting style. Sessions will focus on relationships within the family, communication, negotiation, decision-making and strategies to reduce conflict.

The group aims to develop:

- relationships between teenagers and parents/carers
- a calmer home life
- confidence when talking about difficult issues
- an understanding of teenage needs and development

- Parents and carers of pre-teens and teenagers who are currently in years 5 & 7 but there may be availability for years 5 & 8


