#### Nursery Learning

This week in Nursery, we have been learning about water transport. The children have enjoyed singing 'Row, row, row your boat' and they also made their own boat using junk modelling. Then they tested it to see whether it would float or sink in the water tray.





#### Resource Base Learning



This week, we have been encouraging the children to work together and develop their turn taking and teamwork skills. We practised when stacking plastic bottles on bamboo to help build the school greenhouse. The children took it in turns to have different roles and were so patient and calm when waiting for their turn to stack the bottles.

This week in our Zones of Regulation session, Blue Pathway discussed what expected and unexpected behaviour would look like at school and at home. We discussed how people would feel if we mainly showed expected behaviour, and we considered how others would feel if we mainly showed unexpected behaviour. We used our knowledge to then complete a sorting

activity to show the difference between expected and unexpected behaviour.

#### Year 1 Trip to Lewisham Mosque

This week, Year 1 bundled onto the bus for our trip to Lewisham Mosque. Once there, we took our shoes off to go in the prayer hall, where Imam Ashraf told us all about Islam and showed us some important objects, including the Qur'an, a hijab and a prayer mat.





### Year 2 - Trip To The Science Museum

As part of our Incredible Inventions topic, Year 2 visited the Science Museum. We went to the Space Exhibition and saw the Apollo 10! We also went to the Modern World Exhibition and saw some amazing inventions like the first ever Ford car. It was an amazing trip enjoyed by all.







#### Year 3 - Science

In Science, we have been finding out all about animals including humans. We have found out about the different food groups and the importance of a healthy diet. This week we looked at exoskeletons. To extend our learning we made skeletons to protect an egg. We worked in groups and constructed a rib cage out of straw. We then used paper and card to protect the rib cage.









#### Year 4 - Writing

This week, Year 4 had fun acting out the parts of Barney, Stig and the Snargets as part of their writing lessons about Stig of the Dump.










# Year 5 - History






### Year 6-RE


