


Year 4 - Writing

Together in groups, we made huge mind maps of useful vocabulary that we would like to use in our Viking narratives. We found the words from chapters of Odd and the Frost Giants, vocabulary banks used in reading lessons and from dictionaries and thesauruses.

TALKING TEENS 📭



Family Thrive Early Help Co-ordinators are running a free course for parents or carers of teenagers and pre-teens who are looking to better understand and communicate with them – It offers an opportunity to understand what's going on in the adolescent brain and how to understand their feelings and behaviours using an authoritative parenting style. Sessions will focus on relationships within the family, communication, negotiation, decision-making and strategies to reduce conflict.

The group aims to develop:


- relationships between teenagers and parents/carers

What Parents & Carers Need to Know about



Tik Tek is a free social media plotform that lets users create, share and watch short videos ranging anywhere from 15 seconds to 10 minutes in duration. The app gained notoriety for its viral dances, trends and celebrity comeos and can be a creative, fun platform for teens to enjoy. Now available in 75 languages, it,has,more than a billion active users worldwide (as of spring 2022) and is most popular with the under 15 age bracket. In fact, a 2022 alcom report found TikTok to be the most-used social media platform for posting content, particularly among young people aged 12 to 17.

ENABLE FAMILY PAIRING

Family Pointing allows parents to link their TikTak account with their child's and control their settings remotely. Parents can then, for example, turn on Restricted Mode (neckacing the chances of a child seeing inappropriate content), as screen time limits, and manage their child's ability is end messages (and to whom). Children can't alter these settings without parental approval.

DISCUSS THE DANGERS

If your child wants to use TikTok and you're happy for them to do so, it's crucial to tak about the potential risks in this type of appfor example, ensure they understand not to share any identifying personal information – and that they realise they could be exposed to inappropriate content. Thinking critically about what they see on TikTok can help children become generally more social media sarvy.
