Recorder can start from reception up. Saxophone and clarinet can start from year 4, dependent on height.




We also have spaces for **guitar** for children from year 2 up.

Year 2 – Writing Letters




Year 3 – Saving Water

by hanging up plates covered in Vaseline and seeing how many dirt particles stick to them.




Year 5 - Water Pollution

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about

QR CODE SCAMS

WHAT ARE THE RISKS? QR code scams (also known as 'quishing',) involve the malicious use of Quick Response (QR) codes to deceive people into revealing personal information or downloading harmful software. These scams exploit QR codes' convenience and widespread use – for example, in adverts, restaurant menus and public notices, with criminals installing take QR codes which direct users to bogus sites.

PAYMENT SYSTEMS 🥭 👛

Cybercriminals may seek to change a QR code that a related to a legislimate payment service, such as in a resistuarant. If a customer scame the QR code expecting to order and pay for goods or services (such as a med in this case). I say may be directed to a site controlled by the scammers, Entering their payment details would then affect the criminals to defraud them.

DISCOUNTED GOODS

A poster promises goods or services at a discounted cost, requiring people to scan a QR code to register and pay. The poster, however, is malicious, and there is no discount. Again, providing your payment details would allow the criminal to access your funds. This scarn is reasonably common and is often found in our parks in major cities.

PRIZE DRAWS

A Cff code is provided for a price draw, advertised on a poster which is Elety on display in a public space. Scanning the Q8 code will result in being asked to provide further. Information (such as your emailed direct, name, address or phone number), which is then used by criminals for further social angineering attacks or even identity froud.

WIFI CONNECTION

conning a QE code may be the means of annecting to the Wi-FI network in a hotel or ther public area. This is sauchly legitimate, but the QE code is a take. It could result in similate viewing your boosening bittory and rown your login details. FAKE EVENTS AND TICKETS

A power highlights news reporting an upcoming event, or reporting an additional allocation of tickets for a sold-out concert or other performance. It directs the user to scan a Oit code for more information, to register or possibly se pay. The QR code then leads to a lake site hosted by scammers, alming to gather date on the user for have attacks or to exploit ar defraud them immediately.

Advice for Parents & Educators

BE VIGILANT

Officiales are becoming more prevations, and cyber oriminate are increasingly seeking to use them to steal information and commit froud. As such, it is important to romain aware of the risks. Always consider these safety concerns before scanning a Qf code and avoid doing so unless you're certain it's lightimate. Be sure to keep your device's operating system updated as well, I keep you protected from known safety risks.

CHECK FOR SIGNS OF TAMPERING

Where QR codes are printed or displayed, check for any sign of temporing as a sticker with a new QR code being placed over the top of the previous code, for instance. Where there are signs of tempering, you should consult a member of staff (if you're in a hotel or rectauront, for example) or simply avoid scanning.

CHECK THE URL

Most phones now show the web address or ulit which a QR cade connects by, and they typically require users to accept being boton to this address before progressing. Check that the web address matches that of the site or service you've expecting to access via the QR code you've scanned if it seems dubious in any way, don't cirk on it.

USE TRUSTWORTHY SOURCES

Consider the source of the QR code and its trustworthiness. A QR code for payment in a restourant, for example, is fixely to be legitimate if you can see it printed on every menu, a random poster pinned up in the street or in a building it comider if more likely to be fraudulent. If you're unsure, err on the side of coulien and don't scan the code.

USE THE DEFAULT QR CODE SCANNER

Most mobile devices come with the chility to scan CR codes built into the carrera app. Where possible, you should coek to use this default functionality and avoid the use of third-party QR scanning apps which may have themselves been lampered with or compromised. Stick to reputable methods.


