







Year 3 - Geography

Year 4 - Melting Chocolate


As part of our 'States of Matter' unit, we have been learning about solids, liquids and gases and the processes that transform them from one state to another. To work scientifically we planned an investigation about melting chocolate. As a group, we thought of an enquiry question eg. When we change the type of chocolate, what will happen to the time it takes to melt? In the next lesson, we then carried out the enquiry and recorded our results. We then had a real treat being able to eat the melted chocolate at the end of the lesson!




Year 5 - Geography

In Geography, the children have been learning about rivers and their features. They have explored the journey of a river from its source to its mouth, identifying key features such as meanders, tributaries, and deltas. The class has studied various rivers around the world, with a particular focus on the River Thames. They have examined its course, significance, and the role it plays in the geography and history of London. This week, the children have been busy designing their own river models, which they will soon bring to life using a range of materials. This hands-on project is helping them to visualise and better understand how rivers shape the landscape over time. The children are excited to showcase their creativity and deepen their understanding through this engaging activity.









Year 6 - Orienteering



Information for Pupil Premium children in Year 5

- St. Olave's is a grammar school for boys, taking girls into our sixth form, based in Orpington. Entry to the school is via a selective entrance test taken during a child's year 6. This is a two stage process whereby the top 450 applicants from our stage 1 test are invited to proceed to our stage 2 test.
- Each year we offer up to 10 places for year 7 entry to applicants in receipt of Pupil Premium who have proceeded to our stage 2 entrance test.
- If your son is in receipt of Pupil Premium (or has been at any point in the 6
 years prior to our application deadline date) and he proceeds to the stage 2
 test then he will be in a very good position to gain a year 7 place at St. Olave's.
- Applications for Year 7 Entry 2026 are open now and close on Monday 30
 June 2025 at Midday. Documentary proof of pupil premium status must be uploaded at time of application.
