Outstanding Achievements




Yasviny and Sharviny have been awarded special trophies and certificates for completing maths challenge activities at their Saturday school.


Arthur achieved a distinction in his grade 1 piano exam.






Year 4 — Design and Technology - Structures

Year 1 Teddy Bear Adventure

Last week, we enjoyed a lovely teddy bear adventure inspired by the story "Whatever Next!" by Jill Murphy. We created a wonderful story box as well as our own teddy bears! Just like Baby Bear, we went on a moonlight adventure and brought the story to life with our story boxes.

One of the highlights was when the children and their families created their own story boxes, filled with props, books, and imaginative ideas to continue the adventure at home. It was wonderful to see the children playing and learning alongside their families, laughing, chatting, and making special memories. Thank you to all the parents and carers who joined us. Your enthusiasm and support helped make the day truly magical.













Oracy at Torridon

We are currently in our second year of the Talk Matters Project to support children's oracy at Torridon, and what a year it has been!

In classrooms, we have working on the quality of our partner talk by using Round Robin, Rally Robin and Timed Pair Share. These strategies mean that every child gets the opportunity to speak and share their ideas. We have then extended the quality of our discussions by either agreeing, challenging or building on to what our peers have said.

Outside of the classroom, some children have been taking part in Talk Boost interventions to help them with their language and attention and listening skills.

The Talk Matters project has also allowed us to transform our playground by introducing OPAL play. OPAL has meant that children are far more engaged, mix with different ages and work together using their language and team building skills during playtime.

For parents, we have held many workshops with our speech and language therapists including: attention and listening, social skills, language development in EYFS and KS1 and KS2.

We also held wellbeing events so that families could create magical memories with their children to spark engaging conversations. In nursery, we opened up our doors for Share a Story sessions every Friday. We also held two successful Family Film Nights, and we cannot forget our amazing OPAL Playdate where parents got to experience the magic of our playground with their children, and lastly we also had a Teddy Bear adventure to end the year.

It has truly been a successful year and you may have even caught Torridon on BBC News to talk about the project and the value it brings to our children's lives.

Parenting Courses

The Triple P group — Positive approaches to Parenting, is a face-to-face programme for parents and carers of children aged 2-10 years old. It is a broad-based parenting intervention where parents actively participate in a range of exercises to help manage their child's behaviour.

The sessions are delivered over six-eight weeks, and they involve: four group sessions, which last two hours each, and also three individual phone consultations to assist parents with independent problem solving whilst they are practicing skills learnt from the sessions.

What is covered in the group sessions?

- Session 1: What is Positive Parenting Why children behave as they do
- Session 2: Helping children develop Encouraging good behaviour and preventing misbehaviour.
- Session 3: Strategies for managing misbehaviour
- Session 4: Planning ahead for challenges and high-risk situations
- Sessions 5-7: 1:1 session to support the use of new positive parenting strategies and review goals.
