Year 1 - North and South Pole



This week, Year 1 studied the North and South Pole in order to distinguish between the different animals that live there. We learned that Antarctica is considered a desert, because it receives very little rain. We also learned that the Artic is also called the Tundra, and it is one of the harshest environments in the world! We drew our favourite poles, taking care to include the correct animals for each habitat.

Year 2 – Food Critics

This week, Year 2 were food critics as part of our exciting "Inside India" topic. We had a delicious tasting session of a variety of tasty Indian delicacies such as crispy onion bhajis, fluffy naan bread, crunchy poppadoms with sweet mango chutney, and mouth-watering samosas. Our young reviewers had a great time sharing their honest opinions just like real critics! Year 3 – Geography

This week in geography, the children learnt about the difference between migration push and pull factors. We then wrote about a dish from a culture we would like to try, as well as drawing the flag of the country's national dish.

Year 4 – Drama for Writing

We explored the character of Ananda the elephant from our core text 'The Girl Who Stole an Elephant'. After making our own elephant masks, we used movement and voice to step into role. We acted out scenes from the jungle, imagining how Ananda might feel being taken from the palace and escaping with Chaya, Nour, and Neel. Some of us believed he would enjoy the freedom of the jungle, while others thought he might miss the comfort and care of the palace. We will used this exercise as inspiration for writing our news report about the stolen elephant.



Year 5 – Clay Rivers

In art this term, the children have been exploring sculpture using clay, with their work thoughtfully linked to our topic on 'Rivers'. Drawing on their knowledge of river

features, they created imaginative clay models using the technique of 'Adding and Subtracting Clay'. This hands-on method allowed them to shape and refine their sculptures with creativity and care. The children particularly enjoyed the painting stage, where they brought their models to life with colour and detail. One child shared that she appreciated the freedom this technique gave her to express herself artistically, highlighting the creative confidence the project has inspired.



Year 6 – Bouldering Trip

Year 6 children swapped the classroom for climbing shoes as they took on the challenge of Bouldering. The children tackled a series of indoor climbing routes that tested their strength, balance and determination. For many it was their first experience of bouldering but they quickly rose to the challenge. It was wonderful to see the children encouraging each other, celebrating successes and pushing themselves out of their comfort zones.



Forest School Summer Camp

We are very excited to announce that Kelley, our qualified Forest School Leader plans to run a 2-week summer camp in our woodland this summer!
