

Thanks to your support, we'll be using the rewards from the fair to buy even more fantastic books for our reading room — ready for the children to enjoy during the school day





Reception - All About Me








Resource Base – Zones of Regulation

This week, the Resource Base have been using the Zones of Regulation, a helpful framework to recognise and share their feelings. Using colours to represent different emotional states supports the children to understand their emotions and develop strategies to regulate themselves. We are proud of their growing confidence in expressing how they feel throughout the day.







Year 1 - RE

This week, we studied objects found in the natural world and thought about whether they were dead, alive or had ever been alive. We shared our ideas about who made the objects and compared our different beliefs. We learned that different religions have different ideas about how the universe was created and that some people don't have a religion at all. We spent time using natural objects to create pictures. We also thought about how we should treat our planet and the animals that live on it.











Year 2 – Writing


This week in year 2, we heard that some mysterious things were happening around Catford—trees were burnt, bins melted, and huge scratch marks were left on fences and walls! After asking lots of brilliant questions, we discovered the culprit... it was the City Dragons! This fiery troublemaker has even left glossy, glistening eggs in people's gardens. Year 3 - Maths

In year 3, we used dienes to partition 3-digit numbers. This hands-on method helped everyone understand place value. We could see and touch the value of each digit and physically build each number. We were then able to compare two numbers and discuss which was greater.









Year 4 — Maths









In year 4, our mathematicians have been diving deep into the world of place value. We've been revisiting key concepts and learning how to partition and represent numbers up to 10,000.


The classroom was buzzing with excitement as pupils became number detectives, using dienes and place value counters to build and explore 3- and 4-digit numbers. We developed a stronger understanding of how numbers are structured and how each digit holds its own unique value on a place value chart

Year 5 - Writing

This week in year 5, we began to read our class text 'The London Eye Mystery' by Siobham Dowd. As the first chapter began we a highly captivating flashforward, we decided to write our own flashforward based on the story 'Malala's Magic Pencil' written by Malala Yousafzai.







Year 6 - Drama

This term, year 6 are diving into our core text: Safiyyah's War, using drama to explore key moments from the story and bring the characters' emotions to life. Through role play and performance, pupils develop their emotive vocabulary and deepen their understanding of character motivation and historical context. These drama sessions support key writing features such as tone, perspective and informal language.
