The children looked around the school environment for shapes, and they used shapes to create their own shape picture.










Resource Base

Using cones to measure distances, the children tested their jumps and compared results—lots of excitement and great measuring skills in action!






Year 2 African Adventure

This half term in Year 2, we have begun our exciting new topic — African Adventure! We started by reading the story *Meerkat Mail*, which follows the adventures of a curious meerkat named Sunny. Sunny even decided to go on a very special holiday — all the way to Torridon Primary School! He loved playing in the sandpit, cooking in the mud kitchen, relaxing in the book nook, and he even tried our school lunches. Sunny was so excited that he wrote a postcard to his meerkat family, and the children had great fun imagining what he might say as they created their own postcards to share his exciting news.











Year 3 Rocks!

Year 3 have been finding out all about different types of rocks and their properties. We learned about how they were formed and what they might be used for.

Sedimentary rocks are formed when small pieces of rocks, dust, shells and sand are cemented together. Igneous rocks are formed by magma or lava as it cools down and becomes a solid. Metamorphic rocks are formed by intense heat and pressure underground.

















Year 5 — Geography Spotlight

This week, Year 5 explored the fascinating relationship between geography and climate. Using world maps, the students located various countries and examined their positions using longitude and latitude. They discussed how proximity to the equator influences temperature and weather patterns, discovering why tropical regions tend to be hot and humid while areas farther away experience cooler climates. It was an exciting way to connect map skills with real-world environmental understanding!











Year 6 - Science

This week in science, the children have been investigating the components that make up a series circuit. They learned how each part—such as batteries, bulbs, switches, and wires—works together to allow electricity to flow.

The class also explored the **symbols used to represent these components** and practiced drawing them accurately. Using these symbols, the children created clear diagrams of different circuits, showing how electrical energy moves through a series connection.

It's been a fantastic opportunity for them to combine practical understanding with scientific representation, and they are now well on their way to becoming confident circuit designers!





Year 5 and 6 girls' football tournament



Last Friday, 16 girls from year 5 & 6 represented Torridon in the Lewisham Games girls' football tournament at St. Dunstan's Jubilee Ground. Split into two teams, each group of girls played five matches against other schools in Lewisham. Using the skills they have been practicing in the Monday training sessions last term, both teams played excellent football against some challenging opposition. They experienced an array of results including coming from a goal down to draw a match, losing by slim margins against experienced teams, and winning matches without conceding.

They scored amazing goals, made some outstanding saves and played with respect throughout. By the end, they finished 3rd and 4th in their respective groups, just missing out on semi-final spots. They worked well in their teams, and the experience will certainly benefit towards their journey as a Saturday League team. Well done to both of our girls' teams!



Saturday League – Girls' team



On Saturday, our Torridon girls' football team played their first two matches of the season. It was a challenging day for the team as they had to first overcome the nerves of playing competitive matches for the first time in front of a cheering crowd. After just one training session on Friday, the girls first focus was understanding their positions and roles on the pitch. It was amazing to see how quickly they adapted to this first challenge as they worked incredibly well both defending and attacking against their first opponents — Horniman. Amariah made some outstanding saves in goal, whilst Yasmine, Melanie, Madison and Ottilie were amazing in defence. They produced excellent tackles and did not allow the Horniman attackers many opportunities to score. Maya, Ameliia, Ivanka and Natalie produced some creative runs up and down the wing, travelling with the ball and tackling their opposing wingers. Lola and Maria secured the centre of the midfield and linked our defence with our attack, whilst Alyssa (our first ever year 4 team member) and Libby worked tirelessly as our attackers and nearly put us ahead on a few occasions.



Overall, the Torridon girls dominated that first game but were incredibly unlucky as in the last few seconds of the match, a long ball went through our defence and a lone Horniman attacker had the time to score the only goal of the game. A 1-0 loss in our first match, but an incredible game to set the tone for the rest of the season. Their second game, against Gordonbrock, was a different challenge altogether. They came second in the league last season

and produced a 5-1 win against the team they played before our game. They are an experienced side with

some academy players — but that wasn't enough to stop our girls from playing with passion and determination. A controversial decision from the referee awarded them with a penalty in the first half, but as good as their shot was — Libby in goal made history as the first goalkeeper to save a penalty! In fact, she went on to make countless saves throughout the match. As Gordonbrock kept pressing, our team went into defensive mode and, although our defence remained solid throughout — one goal did manage to slip into the net. Another



close game, and another 1-0 loss — but these results are not a true reflection of just how amazing our girls played on their first day at Blackheath.

There are plenty more games to go and it won't be long before they earn their first points of the season. Well done to all the girls who played on Saturday! Thank you to all the families that stayed to support the team and thank you to Taliya and Alaia for coming to watch the children play with an amazing home-made 'Go Team Torridon' banner! Next week, both our year 5 boys' team and our year 6 boys' team will play their first matches of their campaign. Good luck to the boys
