Reception



It is Christmas! The children enjoyed decorating the Christmas tree and riding Santa's sleigh. This week we continued learning about the Stickman story. They used their imagination to think of different ways that we could use him.









Resource Base

This week in the Resource Base, we strengthened our fine motor skills by decorating pipe-cleaner Christmas trees. We carefully pinched, threaded, and placed beads to create unique festive designs. The activity encouraged coordination, creativity, and focus, and everyone was proud of their beautifully decorated trees.







Year 1 - Trip to the Horniman Museum

This week, we had an amazing adventure at the Horniman Museum, exploring the wonders of the deep blue sea in their fascinating aquarium. As part of our "Under the Sea" theme, we were thrilled to see many of the sea creatures we've been learning about, up close! We spotted clownfish hiding in the anemone, graceful blue tangs gliding by, and jellyfish drifting like tiny umbrellas. There was also an enormous starfish clinging to its rocky bed and seagrass swaying gently, just like in our 'Little Turtle' story.

After our underwater adventure, we headed to the museum gardens, where we made music on the outdoor instruments. It was so much fun creating rhythms and melodies together in the fresh air.










Year 2 - RE

This week in RE, we explored why Christians believe the world needs special care. We learned about important teachings in Christianity that encourage people to look after the Earth and everything in it. We talked about practical ways Christians can show care, such as following the Four R's – Reduce, Reuse, Recycle, and Repair. We came up with lots of great ideas about how these actions can help keep our planet safe and clean. Take a look at what we have been doing...





Year 3 - DT

As part of our DT learning in year 3, the children have been thinking about how to make a strong box out of fabric. To help us chose our fabric stiffener, we carried out an investigation using different solutions to find out which was the most effective. We found that using PVA glue worked the most effectively. The children applied the glue to their chosen fabric. Now all we have to do is wait for it to dry and we can start constructing. Watch this space to see the results!





Year 4 - PSHE

In PSHE lessons, we have been thinking about the assumptions we make based on people's appearances. In this activity, we looked at some photos of people and answered some questions about them. We had to decide on the answers based on how the person looked. Afterwards, we found out the real answers. We reflected on what we wrote and whether any of the real answers surprised us. We reflected that we should not make assumptions based only on someone's appearance.





Year 5

Year 5 took part in a dance workshop this week with Irie Dance Theatre. The workshop was led by choreographer Keha Seebi and linked to the recent live performance they went to see at Catford Broadway earlier in the term.

The children learnt a Ghanian dance which they had viewed in the show.












Year 6 - Science

This week in Science, year 6 explored series and parallel circuits. The children learned how electricity flows differently in each type of circuit and discussed the advantages and disadvantages of both. They worked hard to draw clear diagrams representing series and parallel circuits, adding detailed explanations to show their understanding. It was fantastic to see their curiosity and problem-solving skills in action!



Sitting Volleyball tournament

On Monday, 8 children from years 5 and 6 represented Torridon at the Lewisham Games sitting volleyball tournament at Bonus Pastor. Sitting volleyball is an inclusive team game where children need to hit the ball over the net whilst remaining seated. Our team had the opportunity to play nine 6-a-side matches against other schools in Lewisham and enjoyed winning as well as learning from defeats.

It was a challenging morning as most of the team hadn't played the sport before. Over the course of the morning, they became more confident with their serves, rotations and returning volleys and it was wonderful to see such passion and determination from our children. They worked incredibly well as a team and should be really proud of their efforts on the day. Well done to our sitting volleyball team!
